SELECTION FOR THE AWARDING OF A POST-DOCTORAL POSITION CONTRACT

THE RECTOR

Given Law 30/12/2010 no. 240, and in particular Art. 22-bis;

Given the "Regulations for the Awarding of Postdoctoral Positions Contracts", issued by Rectoral Decree no. 8268-2025, Prot. no. 335035 of 31/07/2025;

Given the request of the Director of the Department of Cultures and Civilizations, Prot. no. 129424 of 06/03/2026, based on the resolution of the Department Council of 03/03/2026, point 6.4);

And **having evaluated** every appropriate element;

DECREES

ART. 1 – SELECTION FOR AWARDING 1 (ONE) POSTDOCTORAL POSITION CONTRACT

This document announces the selection process **IpD18/2026** for the formulation of a ranking for the awarding of n. 1 postdoctoral position contract in the scientific-disciplinary group GSD 10/GLOT-01 THEORIES AND HISTORY OF LANGUAGES, scientific-disciplinary sector SSD GLOT-01/A - Historical and General Linguistics, to perform the research on the topic "**Comparative syntax of Indo-European subordination, FIS 3**", **financed by the Ministry of University and Research under the program Fondo Italiano per la Scienza (FIS3) 2024-2025, FIS-2024-05348, CUP code B53C25004210001.**

The research program concerns (*description of the research program within which the postdoctoral position contract holder will work*): *this research aims to provide the first comprehensive account of the syntactic strategies of subordination across the ancient Indo-European languages. Despite foundational work by Delbrück, Brugmann, and later Lehman (1974), no updated comparative synthesis has integrated the evidence from newly discovered branches such as Anatolian, Tocharian, and Mycenaean Greek. Existing handbooks, including recent HSK volumes, remain largely descriptive and lack a systematic reconstruction of subordinating structures.*

The project advances along three main lines:

- (1) the creation of a corpus-based database of subordinate constructions;*
- (2) the comparative analysis of subordination expressed through non-finite forms (e.g. verbal nouns, participles, converbs, infinitives) alongside finite clause strategies involving complementisers and mood;*
- (3) the historical and comparative evaluation of these patterns with a view to reconstruction.*

While complementisers typically arise through grammaticalization from diverse lexical sources and cannot be traced to a single proto-form, non-finite constructions and converbs display comparable morphological and functional properties across branches. Integrating new data, the project seeks to reconstruct the diachrony of subordination and identify protostages underlying later Indo-European developments.

The purpose of the assignment that will be entrusted to the postdoctoral position contract holder will be (*description of the activities that the postdoctoral position contract holder will have to carry out during the duration of the contract*): *the postdoctoral position contract holder, as a specialist in Anatolian languages, will study the structures of sentence subordination in the main Anatolian languages of the second millennium BC. In keeping with the overall project, the postdoctoral position contract holder will:*

- (1) collect material from second-millennium Anatolian languages to create a database-based corpus of subordinate constructions, shared with other researchers in the group, and developed specifically by a technologist;*

- (2) *conduct philological and diachronic analysis and systematization of subordination structures expressed through non-finite verb forms (verbal nouns, participles, converbs/absolute structures, infinitives) alongside strategies with finite verbs that involve the presence of phrase conjunctions, moods, and tenses;*
- (3) *conduct a historical and comparative evaluation of these models from a reconstructive perspective.*

The postdoctoral position contract will have a duration of twenty-four months, with the possibility of extension in accordance with the law.

Admission to the selection process, and the selection procedure itself, are governed by the following Articles.

ART. 2 – REQUIREMENTS

For admission to the selection process referred to in Art. 1, potential candidates must fulfil the following requirements:

- a) PhD in Historical Linguistics with a focus on Anatolian studies and syntax problems;
- b) Possession of a scientific-disciplinary curriculum suitable for carrying out the research activity envisaged in this announcement;
- c) Knowledge of the following foreign language: English;
- d) Other requirements: documented research and/or development experience in the disciplinary sector: GLOT-01/A - Historical and General Linguistics.

Both Italian and foreign nationals are admitted to the selection process, as long as the latter have the equivalent qualifications or an ideal academic and professional background for the intended research. If a candidate has not applied for official recognition of equivalency in the Italian system for any qualifications gained abroad, the suitability of their academic and professional background will be evaluated by the Selection Committee.

Foreign citizens must have an appropriate level of knowledge of the Italian language.

The following are not eligible to participate in the selection process:

- permanent staff employed by universities, public research institutions, and institutions whose advanced scientific qualifications have been recognized as equivalent to a doctoral degree pursuant to Article 74, paragraph 4, of Presidential Decree No. 382 of July 11, 1980;
- those who have held fixed-term research contracts pursuant to Article 24 of Law 240 of 2010, as amended by Legislative Decree No. 36/2022, converted into Law No. 79/2022;
- those who have a kinship or affinity relationship up to and including the fourth degree with a professor affiliated with the Department of Cultures and Civilizations who proposed the post-doctoral position, or with the Rector, the Director General, or a member of the University Board of Directors.

In order to be admitted to the selection process, potential candidates must meet the stated requirements at the time of the application deadline, provided for in art. 3 of this notice.

Exclusion from the selection process due to a lack of the necessary requirements is determined by a reasoned decree from the Rector, which will be notified to the interested party.

ART. 3 – APPLICATIONS AND RULES FOR SUBMISSION

Applications should be printed on plain paper following the outline attached to this call for applications (appendix: Form A) and addressed to *Magnifica Rettore dell'Università degli Studi di Verona – U.O. Dottorati e Contratti di Ricerca*.

Applications may be submitted in the following way:

- sending the documentation in pdf format, to the e-mail address ufficio.protocollo@pec.univr.it, within the peremptory deadline indicated above. The submission may also be made by an unauthenticated electronic mail address.

No other forms of application submission are admitted.

All applications must be received by the strict deadline of 1 pm, 20 days after the call for applications is concurrently published in the Official University Register on the web page: <http://www.univr.it/it/albo-ufficiale>. If the deadline falls on a public holiday, it will be postponed to the next working day.

Pursuant to Art. 76, Presidential Decree 445/2000 and aware of the criminal penalties for false statements, candidates must state in their application:

- 1) their name and surname;
- 2) their date and place of birth;
- 3) their permanent address, including street name, street number, city, province, postcode, telephone number, tax identification number and email address;
- 4) the number of the selection process in which they wish to participate;
- 5) their nationality;
- 6) that they have no prior criminal convictions, or otherwise report any criminal convictions (even if they have been granted amnesty, cancellation, pardon or legal pardon) or criminal proceedings against them;
- 7) that they have the required qualification as given in Art. 2 of this call for applications, and state the qualification, the date of achievement, the University where it was obtained and any grade obtained, for which the form attached B can be used.
Foreign nationals must also specify if their qualification, if it was awarded abroad, has received official recognition for equivalency to an Italian qualification and they must provide a copy of the title and its translation into Italian or English;
- 8) that they fulfil the other requirements specified in Art. 2 of this call for applications;
- 9) the domicile elected for the purposes of this selection;
- 10) that all the documentation attached to the application is compliant with the originals.

Administration does not assume any responsibility if the applicant is unable to be contacted or for the loss of documents due to errors in the address provided by the applicant, or for a failure to/delay in notifying a change of the address stated in the application, nor for any postal delivery errors or otherwise which are attributable to third parties, unforeseeable circumstances or force majeure.

In any case, any applications which are not signed or that, for any reason, including force majeure, are received by the University of Verona after the above mentioned deadline, will not be considered.

For the evaluation of qualifications and experience, candidates must attach to their application:

- 1) the candidate's scientific-professional curriculum vitae signed;
- 2) publications, up to a maximum of 5 (five);
- 3) copy of a valid identity document;
- 4) a list of the documents and publications attached to their application.

Administration reserves the right to perform checks to verify the truthfulness of substitutive declarations. If such investigations reveal that any declarations are false, the applicant will be excluded from any benefits they may have been awarded from provisions made on the basis of the false declaration, notwithstanding the provisions of Art. 76, Presidential Decree no. 445/2000.

Pursuant to Law no. 104 of 05/02/92, candidates with a disability must make a specific request in their application regarding any aid required, as well as any additional time that may necessary to complete the test.

The signature at the bottom of the application is not subject to authentication, in accordance with Presidential Decree no. 445/2000.

ART. 4 – EXCLUSION FROM THE SELECTION PROCESS

Candidates are admitted to the selection process under the condition that the Rector may with due reason exclude those who do not fulfil the selection requirements from the selection process at any time.

ART. 5 – SELECTION COMMITTEE

The Selection Committee, composed of three members and any substitutes (chosen from among professors and researchers and from subject matter experts) in accordance with the provisions of Article 6, paragraphs 1, 6, 7, and 8 of the Regulations referred to in the introduction, will be appointed after the deadline for applications. Its composition will be promptly announced via Rectoral Decree and will be made public through electronic publication on the website, available at the following link: <http://www.univr.it/it/albo-ufficiale>.

ART. 6 – SELECTION PROCEDURE

The selection will be based on the evaluation of qualifications and an interview, for which the Selection Committee has a maximum total of 100 points available for each candidate, distributed as follows:

• PhD	Max. points	20
• Academic publications (max n. 5) <i>[5 points will be awarded for each monograph and 3 points for each article]</i>	Max. points	20
• Work experiences in the research field	Max. points	20
• Other qualifications	Max. points	10
• Interview	Max. points	30
TOTAL	points	100

The candidate's academic qualifications and experience must be related to the following fields: GLOT-01/A - Historical and General Linguistics and specifically Anatolian linguistics and philology, Indo-European linguistics, historical syntax.

The interview will focus on the following topics: Anatolian linguistics and philology, Indo-European linguistics, historical syntax.

During the interview, the candidates' knowledge of English language will be checked.

Candidates who achieve an overall score of at least 60 points out of 100 will be considered eligible.

Candidates' qualifications and experience will be evaluated before the interview, based on the documents submitted.

The scores obtained in the qualification assessment will be disclosed to candidates before the interviews.

To take part in the interview, candidates must provide a current, valid ID document.

Candidates who do not show an ID document or have only an expired ID document will not be admitted to the interview.

The interviews will take place at 10.00 am (Italian time) on 14th April 2026 and they will be conducted remotely, using the ZOOM platform.

Candidates must ensure that the workstation from which they will hold the interview is equipped with a webcam, indispensable for recognition, and equipped with a microphone and headphones or audio speakers. The possibility for each candidate to attend the interview of the other candidates must be guaranteed.

Failure / incorrect communication of personal contact details, failure to connect and / or unavailability of the candidate on the day and time established, or failure to show the identification document will be considered a waiver of participation in the interview, and therefore of selection, whatever the cause.

ART. 7 – RANKING LIST

The steps of the selection procedure, including the ranking list, shall be approved by Rectoral Decree. The ranking list will be concurrently published electronically in the Official University Register on the web page: <http://www.univr.it/it/albo-ufficiale>, in compliance with the principles of transparency and protection of personal data.

The successful candidate for the postdoctoral position will be contacted by the relevant Administration office to accept the assignment and submit the required self-certifications.

In the event of a tie, preference will be given to the candidate belonging to the less represented gender among the candidates participating in the selection process and, secondarily, to the younger candidate.

The merit ranking is valid for 180 days from the date of approval of the ranking list.

ART. 8 – CONTRACT SIGNATURE

The Research Area – Doctoral Programs and Research Contracts Unit will invite the successful candidate to sign the postdoctoral position contract via email. The contract must be signed by the deadline indicated in the email. The interested party may request a justified deferral, provided that the deferral is compatible with the research activity being performed. Failure to sign within the deadline will be considered a renunciation of the position and will result in the candidate being removed from the ranking list.

ART. 9 – NATURE OF THE CONTRACT

The postdoctoral position is a fixed-term employment contract

The total annual amount of the postdoctoral position, net of administrative burden, is € 28.571,42, to be paid to the recipient in deferred monthly instalments. The salary is not subject to indexation or revaluation and it is subject to current tax and social security regulations.

The employment relationship established between the University of Verona and the postdoctoral appointee is governed by the applicable provisions, including tax, welfare, social security, and insurance coverage for employment income.

The University provides insurance coverage against accidents at work and occupational diseases and for third-party liability.

Postdoctoral positions do not confer any right of access to University positions.

Post-doctoral positions are incompatible with:

- a) any other employment relationship, including part-time or fixed-term, at public or private entities;
- b) holding research grants, including at other universities or public research institutions;
- c) holding research contracts pursuant to Article 22 of Law 240/2010, including at other universities or public research institutions;

- d) holding research positions pursuant to Article 22-ter of Law 240/2010, including at other universities or public research institutions;
- e) holding fixed-term researcher contracts pursuant to Article 24 of Law 240/2010, including at other universities or public research institutions;
- f) holding doctoral research scholarships or other scholarships, awarded for any reason by national or foreign institutions, except when these are for international research mobility.

The postdoctoral position is not compatible with attending bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, PhD, or medical specialization programs, in Italy or abroad. The postdoctoral position entails unpaid leave of absence for employees working in public administrations.

Without prejudice to the above, the postdoctoral appointee may not, in any case, carry out activities that could create a conflict of interest with the University's activities or that prevent the proper conduct of the research activity.

ART. 10 – SAFEGUARD PROVISIONS

For any matters not provided for by this announcement, please refer to the University's Regulations for the post-doctoral position contracts, Article 22-bis of Law No. 240/2010, and applicable laws, where applicable.
