

Dr. Giosuè Gulli, MD, PhD

After receiving his MD degree at the University of Verona, Italy, Dr. Gulli completed Physiology and Medicine internships at the same University in 1997. He subsequently completed a four year PhD in Physiology at Verona (Italy) and Leeds (UK) Universities. Later he started his specialist training in Neurology at the Free University of Erlangen (Germany). He had additional training in Stroke Medicine by Dr J. Bamford in the Department of Neurology in Leeds (UK) and completed his specialist training in Italy at the University of Verona. After the completion of his specialist training he spent one year in London by Prof H. Markus (St George' s University of London) as Clinical Research Fellow. Currently he is Stroke Physician in Verona, Italy and Honorary Stroke Consultant at St George' s Hospital, London.

Dr. Gulli has conducted numerous basic science and clinical studies about the Autonomic regulation of the cardiovascular function in health and disease. He also took part in a research expedition in Ethiopia for the investigation of Autonomic function and cerebral blood flow autoregulation in native high altitude dwellers. Subsequently he has shifted his research interest in Stroke science. Lately, under Prof Markus' s supervision he has been involved in a large prospective genetic study in African and Afro-Caribbean patients and in a prospective study of patients with posterior circulation stroke.
