

CURRICULUM VITAE

Antonio Fiaschi was born in Pisa on 26 February 1942.

On July 11, 1966 he obtained his degree in Medicine at the University of Padova with the maximum score, the thesis was entitled "The study of the intramuscular nerve endings".

On July 23, 1969 he obtained, with the maximum score, his specialization in Mental and Nervous Diseases, the thesis was entitled "Modifications of the nerve conduction velocity during ischemia".

In 1970 he attended the Institute of Neurophysiology in Copenhagen, directed by Prof. F. Buchthal, where he broadened his knowledge in the fields of electromyography and clinical neurophysiology.

On May 20, 1983 he became Associate Professor in Clinical Neurophysiology at the University of Verona.

In 1985 he was nominated Professor and Director of the first Neurology Clinic of the University of Cagliari till 1988. In 1989 he was transferred to the University of Verona, where he is covering the same position.

He is a member of the Managing Council of the Italian Society of Neurology.

His research studies have been aimed at the various aspects of Clinical Neurophysiology and trying to apply these to Neurorehabilitation.

In 1990 he was nominated member of the coordinating committee of the Intersocietary Study Group for Neurorehabilitation, which is actively working towards the promotion and the definition of coordinated, interdisciplinary and multicenter activities and research in this field.

He is Past President of the Italian Society of Neurological Rehabilitation (S.I.R.N.)

From 1998 to 2009 he directed the ward of Neurological Rehabilitation in the University General Hospital "G.B. Rossi" of Verona.

Since 1999 he has been directing the Specialization Medical School of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation of the University of Verona.

In 2005 he was nominated Head of the Department of Neurological and Visual Sciences.

Since September 2009 he has been directing the ward of Neurology in the University Hospital of Verona and the Specialization Medical School of Neurology of the University of Verona.

He is also author of more than 300 papers.
