EDUCATION

Enrolled in the Faculty of Education (formerly Magistero) at the University of Verona, where she graduated on March 20, 1991, in Pedagogy with a thesis titled "Problems - Means - Opportunities for a Modern Geography in Primary School", receiving a score of 110/110 summa cum laude (110 su 110 e Lode).

Winner of the public national competition for teaching in Elementary School (now Primary School), she served as a tenured teacher in public elementary schools from 1987 to 1995. In 1993, she obtained the qualification of teacher trainer at the Regional Institute for Educational Research, Experimentation, and In-Service Training (IRRSAE Veneto) for the programs "*FoRePrInt - Relational Training of Teachers for Integrated Educational Planning*" and "*Continuity and Evaluation*". RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

Geographical Education and Didactics of Geography

Scientific activity began in the late 1980s with an investigation into elementary school teachers' conceptions of Geography, published in the *Quaderni dell'Istituto di Geografia*, Faculty of Arts and Philosophy, University of Verona. Her pedagogical background and primary teaching experience formed the basis for developing a specific scientific interest in the formative and educational value of geography as a way of looking at the world and understanding its complex interrelations.

Since the early 1990s, due to the reform of the Geography curriculum in compulsory schooling, she focused on geography didactics and innovative approaches such as educational continuity and spatial representations.

From autumn 1995, she dedicated herself to the cognitive role and importance of the discipline, joining an interdisciplinary research group for educational innovation and the creation of guidebooks, textbooks, and other teaching materials, dealing with the relationship between Geography, thinking strategies, and competency assessment. The products were published by Fabbri Editori.

Critical engagement in this field, fueled by scientific debates within the Italian Association of Geography Teachers (AIIG) and the IGU Commission on Geographical Education, as well as her role as instructor for Geography and Didactics of Geography for Primary Education Sciences, led to reflections on the relevance of geographical training and the value of geographical education in promoting social values such as peace. Examples include contributions presented at the Jubilee 2000 - Studiorum Universitatum Docentium Congressus and recently at Eugeo 2019 (Galway), respectively titled "*Didactics and ethics in today's education. A necessary relation for the future management of an effective territorial system*" and "*Geographical education and peace. Suggestions from a contemporary interpretation of the CISV project*" in the session "*Teaching Europe and for Europe. Strategies for a geographical education in critical times*", subsequently accepted in the journal *J-Reading*.

Geography and Environment

During the 1995-2000 period, within the framework of the AGeI Working Group research on the problems of the Italian Mountain, of which she was a member, she analyzed settlement dynamics in the Venetian sub-regions of Valpolicella and Lessinia, and for the Apennine area, in Frignano. Research work in hilly and mountainous areas increased her interest in the environment and its problems, viewed through new perspectives of Quality, Ethics, Sustainability, and Responsibility; specific issues studied included waste and water management, and the protection of natural, cultural, and productive resources, with particular reference to protected areas, linking with tourism and local territorial enhancement (leading to a collaboration with the Italian Touring Club and the Province of Verona for a study on food and wine routes, resulting in the publication *Le strade del vino e dei sapori nel Veronese*).

Several studies were developed in Lessinia and the Mantua area, and in 2005 she collaborated with the AGeI Working Group *GECOAGRI-LANDITALY - Comparative Geography of European and Extra-European Agricultural Areas*. Two missions to Tunisia (2005 and 2007, for a total of

approximately 50 days) allowed her to deepen the study of Ichkeul Park as a natural and cultural asset within the broader scenario of UNESCO World Heritage.

Attention to karst landscapes and the quality of water resources in relation to human communities led to studying areas of the Guizhou province (southwestern China) from an anthropic perspective, within a co-funded international scientific cooperation project by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Working with the Science and Technology Department of Guizhou Province and Guizhou Normal University as a member of the Italian team (coordinated by the Natural History Museum of Verona), she conducted field investigations: in 2003 in Hong Lin focusing on water supply in karst villages; in November 2004 and November 2005 in Libo County focusing on water resource management in relation to local tourism development projects. She participated in several conferences, including the *Sino-Italian Workshop on Karst and Caves of Guizhou* (Guiyang, November 5-10, 2003) presenting "*The Karst Areas between protection and Development: a Geographical Approach*", and in 2005 a contribution to the study day "*Projects for the Sustainable Development in Libo County – Guizhou Province*". Some outcomes were presented (Poster session) at the IGU-International Geographical Union Congress in Scotland, 2004. During this period, she also collaborated with the AGel Working Group *East Asia and Oceania*.

Another research direction involved Geography's contribution to developing an environmentally conscious culture (interpreting the environment as a complex, dynamic system with unique traits) and the necessity for information, training, and education. This is addressed in the volume *L'Ambiente. Geografia Educazione e Formazione* (2001) and her contribution on educational farms (2006). This was also a topic of scientific debate at *I lunedì della Geografia Cafoscarina* with the proposal "*Geoeducando. La Geografia e l'Educazione ambientale. Spunti di Riflessione*" (May 27, 2002).

In the evolution of the idea of sustainability, she focused on food and food waste, crossing into social geography and resulting in a contribution in the *Bollettino SGI* and an expanded version in French within a book volume. In the last years, her interest in water resources is being developed through the protection and enhancement of the waters of Montorio Veronese in collaboration with local actors.

Geography and Migration

Her research has touched on various aspects of migration, including hometown associations, the role of remittances, and female migration. Regarding migration dynamics in Italy, she particularly focused on Senegalese migration.

From 2007 to 2010, conducting one mission per year to southern and northern Senegal, she investigated the role of associations in forming migration spaces, the consequences in origin and destination countries, and the territorial effects of remittances, the latter treated in a contribution for the *Bollettino della SGI* (2010). Certain research phases, originating from synergies among the involved actors, received funding under the University Cooperint - Staff Mobility Program.

Since 2010, she has been a member of the international research group *REMIGRAF - Réseau d'Etude des Migrations internationales africaines* and has spoken at international conferences organized by Cheikh Anta Diop University of Dakar and Gaston Berger University of Saint Louis. At the latter, she presented a joint paper on female migration in Northern Italy at the international conference *Regards croisés sur les migrations internationales féminines et la protection sociale* (June 29-30, 2010) organized by GERM (Groupe d'Etudes et de Recherches sur les Migrations). She promoted framework agreements with Cheikh Anta Diop University of Dakar (2007), renewed in 2012 and 2022 (currently active).

Starting with the funded project PRIN 2008 "*Migrations and processes of cultural interaction: forms of integration and territorial organization in certain Italian realities*" (coordinator Prof. C. Brusa)—acting as an external collaborator—and continuing to participate in the AGel Working Group *Migrations and Mobility*, she explored various aspects concerning African communities in immigration areas.

She was the scientific head for the research project "*African communities and good practices: a territorial investigation*" (University of Verona, African Film Festival Committee, Nigrizia Multimedia, Diocesan Missionary Center, 2012-2015), part of which was presented at the international Metropolis meeting (ISMU, Milan, November 3-7, 2014).

These experiences contributed to moving past a simplified view of African countries involved in migration flows; this led to authoring a volume on West Africa (2013) aimed at highlighting the dynamism, complexity, variety, and richness of the area, leveraging aspects such as its significant film production. With the departmental project *MiCuTer - Migrations, Cultures, Territories* (2018-2020, collaborating with anthropology), she continued to support a multidimensional narrative of African regions and migration, identifying and implementing good practices for policy dynamics. Participation in the *IMPACT Veneto - FAMI* Research Project (2018-2022) allowed her to continue reflecting on territorial responses to immigrant populations, contributing to the collective volume of the same name (2022). Based on an interest in second generations (2014), she participated in a national project on contemporary issues regarding foreign students, schools, and territories, co-editing the volume *Una scuola inclusiva. Azioni per contrastare i rischi di dispersione di alunne e alunni di origine straniera* (FrancoAngeli, 2023). Amid growing scientific focus on female migration dynamics, research in this area continued from 2020 to 2022 through collaboration with the international research project *MFAO - Mobilités transfrontalières des Femmes en Afrique de l'Ouest*. Since A.Y. 2018-2019, an international scientific cooperation agreement (University of Passo Fundo) has been active for the comparative study of Senegalese migration in Italy and Brazil.

Geography and Development Cooperation

Her interest in Development Cooperation focuses heavily on analyzing university cooperation projects and their potential. For instance, studying the geography of the cooperation project implemented by the University of Verona in Ngozi (Burundi) for training nursing professionals allowed her to identify further good practices to enhance the utility of the educational center buildings for the student body and local territory. In this study, film productions by African directors were proposed as tools for training and valuing the local context, published in *Geotema* (2015).

Interest in the university's role in cooperation was also supported by a 2011 work on refugees (*Geotema*) and by participation in the *Rodas das Culturas* research project developed with the Universidade Federal do Piauí (UFPI) and the Universidade Estadual do Piauí (UESPI) in Teresina (Brazil), managing the framework agreement with Verona. The project, funded by the Veneto Region, focused on enhancing local good practices and relations between communities and territories. As a geography expert, she participated in field research missions to partner universities and Brazilian territories (2010 and 2011), attended workshops, and coordinated incoming mobility for foreign partners (A.Y. 2013-2014).

Her enduring interest in the African continent has most recently focused on humanitarian and university corridors, alongside the role of international networks within a critical analysis of development and cooperation. She participates in the AGel Working Group *Geography, Development Cooperation, and Local Development*. Due to her scientific interests in African areas, she was invited to join the Scientific Committee of the Center for Relations with Africa of the Italian Geographical Society (CRA-SGI), serving from December 2021 to the present.

Social Geography, Cities, and Neighborhoods

Delicate issues concerning changes in urban spaces relative to new inhabitants, such as foreign communities, led her to deepen the link between migration and socio-spatial dynamics in analyzing Verona, supported by the study of local participatory processes. From 2015 to 2017, attention turned to Social Streets. Outcomes were presented in papers like *"Social Street, migrants et ville: le cas d'un quartier de Verona, Italie"* (9e Rencontres Franco-Italiennes de Géographie Sociale, Toulouse-Albi, May 26-27, 2016) and *"Social Street and urban space: geographical considerations starting from the case study of Verona, Veneto Region, Italy"* (Eugeo, Brussels, 2017).

Within theoretical reflections on the contemporary meaning of neighborhoods, the Veronetta district in Verona became a primary case study, expressing a confluence of migration dynamics, community associations, urban renewal, public/private spaces, and cultural heritage usage. This is reflected in the presentation *"Interpreting 'landscape grabbing': when a public/community theatre is used/utilized by/for... A case in Verona (Italy)"*, Galway, Eugeo 2019, or the conference *Veronetta scorre. Voci a confronto* (November 25, 2017, University of Verona), which she designed and coordinated.

Analysis of daily life spaces in the neighborhood, between administrative and perceived boundaries, formed the geographical contribution to the *Atlas Veronetta* project (2016-2017), a network intervention involving the University of Verona, LAA-LAVUE ENSA Paris La Villette, and local associations. Empirical research used interviews and focus groups with key informants, residents, and primary/secondary students.

The geographical contribution was also central to the launch and early phase (2018-2020) of the *Ri-Ciak* project: rethinking a cinema as a community cinema, an action-research project aimed at reclaiming historical sites through active citizenship, presented at the *Veneto Rigenera* workshop (Ca' Foscari Challenge School, December 14, 2018). Traces of this work appear in the article "*Veronetta. Prove di geografia sociale*" in *Geography Notebooks* (2021).

Research also explored practices counteracting exclusion, poverty, and marginalization in favor of social and environmental sustainability. In the project *Cooperiamo per l'economia del buon vivere comune* (2016-2018, ESF 2014-2020), she held scientific responsibility for the territorial aspect of the "*Participating in Sustainability*" axis, with results compiled in the volume *Scintille di Innovazione imprenditiva*.

In cultural heritage enhancement, interdisciplinary research was developed in Borgo Roma through the *ArSaGI Project* (*San Giacomo alla Tomba Archive*, 2016-2018). Based on the archives of the former psychiatric hospital, architectural remnants, and place names, geographical focus targeted the symbolic and material value of this heritage for the current neighborhood, proposing new urban keys in the contribution "*Il San Giacomo, una cittadella nella città di ieri...e per la città di oggi*" (2019).

A current interest involves housing and its territorial expressions across rights, dignity, and resources. The conference *Co-housing: Abitare condiviso* (University of Verona, January 14, 2017) constituted a significant moment of scientific discussion on housing models and sustainability, intersecting with the concepts of migration geography.

She designed and organized the *12th International Seminar on Medical Geography, Collective Spaces/Public Spaces. Senses-Dissents-Consents* (University of Verona, October 10-11, 2019). These scientific interests were enriched by exchanges at Franco-Italian social geography conferences (Tours 2014, Turin 2015, Toulouse 2016, Lecce 2017, Perpignan 2018) and within the AGeI Working Group *Geographies for Society*, for which she managed national scientific coordination for the September 2022 – September 2025 triennium.

Awareness of methodological issues across research areas led her to participate in the AGeI Working Group *Geography and Empirical Research*. Reflections appeared in *Geotema* (2010) and a joint contribution at the XXXII Italian Geographical Congress (Rome, June 7-10, 2017).
