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## Part #2 Application process

### What will you be asked during your online application?

- All your contacts and those of your parents
- Your level of education
- Your home university
- Subject you are studying (check the box on the right to help you choose the right department)
- Your mobility dates:

#### Fall semester:

start of courses: 1st week of September  
end of courses: around 15 January

#### Spring semester:

start of courses: 2nd week of January  
end of courses: 30 May

**Retakes for both semesters:** between 1st and 30 June.

### The organisation of courses

#### Choice of your courses:

This section is very important as it concerns your course & class choice.

Students nominated at our faculty are authorized to select courses in all three departments :

- Institute of Economics and Management
- Institute of Social Sciences
- Institute of Geography and Planning

You can choose classes at all levels, from the 1<sup>st</sup> year of the Bachelor's to the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the Master's. Please note that we will check that a student studying at the Master's level is not taking classes at the 1<sup>st</sup> year Bachelor's (Licence in French) level.

Due to the high demand for courses at the **Institute of Economics and Management**, the spots for courses taught in English are limited. **It is therefore compulsory to also choose courses that are taught in French** For the other departments, all courses are taught in French.

Your exchange allows only for study mobility. It is not possible to carry out a traineeship during this period.

**For Master's students, our faculty does not supervise your Master's thesis. You will need to seek support from your home university for this.**

## The provisional academic calendar

This timetable is just a projection of our organisation. It is subject to change. It will be confirmed when you arrive.

	First / fall semester	Second / spring semester
Administrative registration	Last week of August	First week of January
Start of courses	First or second week of September	Second week of January
End of courses	Second week of January	Beginning of May
Exam periods	The official period is scheduled for the last week of December + the 1st week of January. However, some programs schedule their exams outside of this period. You can find out more once you arrive.	The official period is scheduled for the last week of April + the 1st week of May. However, some programs schedule their exams outside this period. You can find out more once you arrive.
Retake exam periods	First 15 days of June	Last 15 days of June

Our semesters start at the beginning of September and January. Late arrivals (last week of September for the fall semester and last week of January for the spring semester) will not be accepted, as classes have advanced too much.

No exams can be rescheduled due to advanced purchase of airline tickets. It is your responsibility to organize yourself and not to leave during the exam period.

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There are two accommodation options:

- In a University Hall of Residence
- In the Private Sector

### In a University Hall of Residence

To book accommodation in a university residence, **you have to submit your application before the deadline indicated above (typically early May and early November)**.

After this deadline, it is not possible to book rooms in our University residences. You will have to find your own accommodation in the private sector.

To apply for university residences, you will need to tick the appropriate box and fill in the information requested in the online application form. We will not be able to book accommodation for applications received after this deadline.

The university's residence department will send you a contract that **you have to sign and return before the date indicated on the contract** to guarantee your accommodation.
