<b>Winter semester</b>	1 October 2026 – 31 March 2027 <b>Lecture period: 12 October 2026 – 5 February 2027</b> Vacation: 22 December 2026 – 8 January 2027
<b>Summer semester</b>	1 April 2027– 30 September 2027 <b>Lecture period: 5 April – 16 July 2027</b> Exams usually take place in the last week of the lecture period or in the week after it ends.
<b>Language of teaching</b>	<p>German with some exceptions: courses in British/American Studies, InterAmerican Studies and 'International Track' Master courses in Sociology, Politics, Economics, Mathematics, Physics and Informatics are taught in English. Some courses in Psychology, Philosophy, History, Education, and Business Administration are also taught in English, mostly on an advanced level. For more information see below (page 3).</p> <p>The language requirements are binding for all students intending to take up studies at Bielefeld University. Otherwise, a successful study period is not possible.</p>
<b>Admission</b>	<p><b>Students need to be nominated by their home university coordinators to the International Office (IO) at Bielefeld University.</b> After the nomination period they will receive an email with information about the online registration process. This mail is usually sent out in May (for winter semester) or November (for summer semester). The IO sends out letters of admission a few weeks after having received the online registration data.</p> <p>Nomination period for <b>winter semester 2026/27</b>: 1 April – <b>1 May 2026</b>          Nomination period for <b>summer semester 2027</b>: 1 October – <b>1 November 2026</b></p>

<b>Language courses and orientation programme for Erasmus- and other cooperation students</b>	<p>The <b>language &amp; orientation programme</b> takes place before the beginning of the lecture period with the following activities amongst others:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Intensive German language course (see below)</li> <li>• University, library and study system, as well as city orientation</li> </ul> <p><b>Intensive German language course</b>          German language course (25 lessons/week) at various levels of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).</p> <p>Programme dates:          → <b>16 September – 7 October 2026</b> (before winter semester classes)          → <b>10 March – 1 April 2027</b> (before summer semester classes)</p> <p>Erasmus and cooperation students whose German language skills are below B2 of the CEFR are expected to participate in these programmes. For students who already have a B2 level of German at the beginning of their studies at Bielefeld University, participation is recommended.</p> <p>During the lecture period German courses at various levels are also offered, however no beginners' courses.</p>
<b>Subject courses and Learning Agreement</b>	<p>The <b>electronic course</b> schedule of all departments will be published online approx. <b>three months before classes</b> begin, i.e. mid-July (for winter semester) and mid-January (for summer semester).</p> <p><u>Please do not send or upload Erasmus+ learning agreements before these publishing dates!</u></p>

<b>Number of courses per semester</b>	The number of courses cooperation students take during their stay at Bielefeld University varies. Students are asked to discuss their study plans – as soon as the courses for the semester in question are online - with their departmental coordinator and/or academic advisor at the home and the host university. This also refers to the recognition of courses at the home university.																		
<b>Credit points/ 'Leistungspunkte'</b>	The recommended workload for Bielefeld students in a degree programme is 30 credits = <i>Leistungspunkte (LP/ECTS)</i> per semester. Erasmus/Cooperation students may take less ECTS/LP in accordance with their German language ability and their arrangements with the home university.

<b>Accommodation</b>	<p>The International Office supports international students in finding accommodation. <b>Living costs &amp; semester fee</b>	Monthly approx. 950 Euro (for housing, meals, books, trips, ...), in addition appr. 300 Euro <i>Semestergebühr</i> (semester fee) to be paid at registration. This is a fee for social services and includes a ticket for free public transport in cities and on regional trains/buses in Germany for the whole semester, i.e. six months. Without payment of the semester fee registration as a student is not possible.																		
<b>Visa &amp; residence permit</b>	<p>Students from most non-EU countries must apply for a study visa in their home country (for exceptions see the website of the German embassy in your home country). They apply for this at the city council's <i>Ausländerbehörde</i> (Foreigners' Registration Office) after registration at Bielefeld University. <b>Health insurance</b>	<p>Health insurance for students is obligatory in Germany and valid proof of it has to be transmitted for enrolment, otherwise enrolment is not possible.</p> <p>Students from EU member states have to present the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) - if applicable - or an equivalent insurance certificate. The EHIC or certificate must be valid until the official end of the semester (31 March or 30 September) or until the end of the academic year (30 September) if students are staying for two semesters.</p> <p>Non-EU citizens need to buy a public/statutory student health insurance in Germany.  <u>Please note:</u> mere travel insurances are not sufficient for enrolment as a student!  All students are asked to ensure that they have adequate insurance cover.</p>

## Language level required for students in cooperation programmes at Bielefeld University

The language requirements specified by the faculty/department concerned are **binding** for all students intending to take up studies at Bielefeld University. Bielefeld University does not require proof of these language skills, but expects that partner universities will only nominate students for a study period at Bielefeld University who have *proven these language skills at their home university*. Otherwise, a successful study period is not possible.

At the beginning of the stay at Bielefeld University this level of language skills is **expected**:

Participation in an intensive German language course before the beginning of the lecture period provides an opportunity for an up-grade by one level within the CEFR. For this, students must attend regularly, hand in the required assignments and do the self-study programme which is part of the intensive course. Students will gain 4 or 5 ECTS for this course, depending on the level they are in.

The level of English is required for students who intend to attend courses taught in English. However, please note that the main teaching language at Bielefeld University is German.

English taught courses are offered in these study programmes: all BA and MA courses in British and American Studies are taught in English, as well as international track Master level courses in Sociology, Political Science, Economics, Intelligent Systems, Informatics, Mathematics and Physics. MA courses in InterAmerican Studies are taught in English or Spanish. Some courses in Psychology, Philosophy, History, Economics und Natural Sciences are also taught in English, mostly on an advanced level. **This means that students of these subjects studying at Bachelor's level need German language skills according to the table above, otherwise they will have a very limited choice of courses!**
