

Application deadline

Semester 1 (Autumn and Full year)

- Nomination and application deadline : From March 15 to May 1st

Semester 2 (Spring)

- Nomination and application deadline : From September 15 to November 1st

Nomination process

First, students need to be nominated by advisors using [our forms](#).


Then, all exchanges students must complete the [online application form](#).

When you fill in the form, please make sure you fill in the university and country of origin as well as the framework of your exchange according to the programme you are applying for:

- **Erasmus+ Programme** - Mobility from Europe
- **International Programme** - Mobility from outside Europe

Documents to enclose with your application:

- Photo (passport format)
- Copy of passport or ID card
- Cover letter in French
- Transcript translated into English or French
- Provisional list of desired courses at Sorbonne Nouvelle University (5 courses to choose from)
- Language Certification



Language requirements

French-speaking candidates must have a **B2 level in French** (DELF or professor attestation) to follow courses and complete assignments. However, **level C1** may be required by **certain departments in Master's programs**.

Non-French speakers can take courses in English, though options are limited to English-speaking world and Applied Foreign Languages subjects. A **B2 level in English** (official test or professor attestation) is required for those taking only English-taught courses.

While beginner French courses are not available, exchange students can take semester-long courses to improve their French language, culture, and methodology. A free intensive French course is also offered in September upon registration.

Course catalogue

You will be able to register for your classes **starting on Orientation Day**. Your main department will be the one where your university nominated you and that appear on your admission letter. **You need to pick at least one course in your main department**. Then, you can register up to 3 departments, main department included.

Academic calendar

Semester 1 / Fall

- Orientation: mid-September
- Classes registration: info will be sent by mail
- Classes begin: end of September
- Semester break: end of October – early November
- Classes end: end of December
- Final exams: end of December (It can last until the mid-January for students staying full academic year)
- Winter break: end of December – early January

Semester 2 / Spring

- Orientation: early-January
- Classes registration : info will be sent by mail
- Classes begin: mid-January
- Semester breaks: February and April
- Classes end: early May
- Final exams: end of April – early May
- Catch up exams : June (only for students staying for 1 year / spring)

Application dates:

- **Semester 1** - March 15 to May 15 2025
- **Semester 2** - October 15 to November 15 2026

You can apply by [fulfilling the online form](#). Please make sure you have been nominated and you also applied for the exchange program. Do not wait to be accepted to apply for accommodation.

Please note that there is no guarantee that your application will be accepted, therefore once you have applied you should start looking for accommodation as soon as possible. You can ask help from the [Welcome Desk](#).
