II. Eligibility

GPA Requirement	Hallym University does not have a specific minimum GPA requirement for incoming exchange students. However, it is essential that students meet the academic criteria established by their home institutions to be eligible for studying abroad.
Language Requirement	<p><i>For courses taught in English</i>, incoming exchange students are not obligated to provide evidence of their English language proficiency. However, their home institution must verify and confirm that the student possesses sufficient English language skills to attend lectures and complete coursework in English before nominating them to our university.</p> <p><i>For courses taught in Korean</i>, there is no mandatory requirement for incoming exchange students to present proof of their Korean language proficiency. However, those who wish to enroll Korean language and culture-related classes designed for International Students (listed in the Courses link on page 3 of this factsheet) should have a beginner to intermediate level of Korean. For general courses taught in Korean, a TOPIK 2 or higher level of Korean is necessary to effectively participate.</p>

Nomination Process	The International Coordinator from partner universities can nominate applicants for the exchange student program using the designated Excel Form that we send via email during the nomination period.	
Application Process	<p>The nominated student, approved by the partner university, must complete and submit the application form along with the necessary supplementary documents within the specified application period.</p> <p>By default, all documents should be submitted online via email. However, students from non-OECD countries must also submit certain documents (refer to page 3) in hard copy via a traceable mail service such as FedEx, DHL, or EMS. These hard copy documents should be sent to the address provided on page 1 of this document.</p> <p>For documents submitted via email, students should send them to the exchange program coordinator at iao33@hallym.ac.kr.</p> <p>You can check whether your country is an OECD member by visiting below link. https://www.oecd.org/en/about/members-partners.html</p>

Once the coordinator reviews the document and there are no issues, you are required to have the document apostilled or legalized by the Korean embassy or consulate in your country. Once the document is legalized, you will need to send it to the Global Engagement Center of Hallym University by post.

	6) Official Bank Statement in English a. The bank statement must show that you have at least the following amounts in U.S. dollars in your account: - For a one-semester exchange student: \$4,200 - For a two-semester exchange student: \$8,400 b. The bank statement must be an official document issued by the bank within 30 days of the date of your application. c. The original document must be sent to the Global Engagement Center of Hallym University by post. d. If the bank statement is under the parent's name, they must send an official family relationship document proving their relationship to the student in English along with the bank statement.	

- ✧ All documents submitted CANNOT be returned to the applicant under any circumstances.
- ✧ All submitted documents must be in English or Korean.
- ✧ For students who have required documents to be submitted by post, the Certificate of Admission can only be issued after the documents have been received and verified by the coordinator at Hallym University.

V. Visa Process

<p>Visa Documents</p>	<p>Upon successful completion of the application process, the Hallym University coordinator will send the Certificate of Admission and other essential documents to both the applicant and the applicant's home university coordinator. These documents are required for obtaining a Korean visa.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Spring semester: Documents are sent in November. • Fall semester: Documents are sent in late May/early June.
<p>Visa Application</p>	<p>Exchange students must obtain a D-2-6 visa from the Republic of Korea Embassy or Consulate in their home country before studying in Korea. This visa is mandatory, even if your country has a visa-waiver program with Korea for tourism or short-term stays. The specific documents required and application process (in-person or online) can vary depending on the embassy and your nationality. Therefore, it is essential to familiarize yourself with these details before applying.</p>

Course Structure	Most courses at Hallym University are worth 3 credits. A three-credit course consists of 45 hours of lectures spread over 15 weeks. Each week includes three hours of class, typically divided into two sessions. Some courses, however, have one three-hour session per week. Additionally, there is one week dedicated to exams, making the total length of a semester 16 weeks.

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Health Insurance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It is mandatory for international students with a D-2 visa to subscribe to the Korean National Health Insurance Service (NHIS). The monthly insurance fee for 2025 is KRW 76,390 (Approx. USD 53), but this may vary from year to year. • Hallym University strongly advises that you also obtain international travel and medical insurance for your exchange period in Korea. This insurance should cover the initial period of the semester before your NHIS becomes effective, as well as any travel outside of Korea during your exchange student program. • Even though you will be required to subscribe to NHIS after receiving your Residence Card and paying the premium, it is still important to have additional international insurance. International insurance fills gaps in NHIS coverage, ensuring comprehensive care during your exchange. 				

Scholarships Available to Exchange Students	<p>Dormitory 3 Language Tutor Scholarship</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eligibility: This scholarship is open exclusively to students residing in Dormitory 3. Students from other dormitories are ineligible. • Selection Process: Applications and selections typically occur during the first week of each semester. The head professor of Dorm 3 conducts interviews and selects approximately 15 tutors. The exact number of tutors may vary per semester. • Scholarship Benefits: Successful tutors who complete their assigned duties will receive a full refund of their semester dormitory fees. Additionally, they will be awarded a rank-based scholarship ranging from approximately KRW 300,000 to KRW 600,000. • Please note that the scholarship amount and conditions are subject to change based on university policies. 	
Buddy Program	Exchange students are paired with Hallym University undergraduate students, known as buddies, who help them adjust to life in Korea and at the university.	
Programs for Exchange Students	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Orientation: An orientation for exchange students is typically held on the Friday before the start of each semester and is mandatory. This event provides an opportunity to familiarize yourself with our international office staff, buddy student, and fellow exchange students. • Field Trip: A one-day field trip is organized for exchange and buddy students on a Saturday near the end of the first or beginning of the second month of each semester. Entrance fees to attractions, transportation costs, and other related expenses are covered. • Farewell Party: To conclude each semester, we host a farewell dinner where exchange students and their buddies can reminisce and bid each other farewell.
